Dear parents and carers,

Exciting visit from author and illustrator Gail Clarke

We are pleased to welcome children's author, illustrator and storyteller Gail Clarke to our school on **Monday 28 November**. Gail will spend the day with us sharing stories in each class during the day. After school, there will be an opportunity to buy Gail's books at a price of £5.50 per book or two books for £10. Please collect your child then go to the school hall from 3:30pm on the day if you are interested in purchasing her books.

Illness

I would like to remind you about our policy regarding illness which is based on the *Public Health England Guidance on Infection Control in Schools (updated May 2016).* This guidance provides information about whether children should be kept away from school and if so, for how long. This guidance is available online. I would like to draw your attention, in particular, to the recommended period to be kept away from school in the case of diarrhoea and vomiting. In this instance, children should not return to school until 48 hours after the last episode of vomiting or diarrhoea.

Taking steps to prevent the spread of illness is always important but it is even more so now in our school as we have a family with a medically complex and immune compromised child. The health and wellbeing of the child who is at risk will depend on the co-operation of all our parents/carers and I am sure that you will all want to help. Would you please therefore inform the school if you suspect that your child/ren may have an infection and ensure that you follow the recommendations in the guidance mentioned above. The family and I would like to thank all of you in advance for your understanding and co-operation in this important matter.

Christmas events

Below are details of the forthcoming Christmas events:

<u>Wednesday 14 December: Carol service:</u> Our annual carol service, which includes Maple's nativity performance, will take place on Wednesday 14 December at 2pm and again at 6pm at St Mary's Church. Please do join us for one, or both, of the services. <u>All</u> children are expected to return for the evening performance and should be brought back to school at 5.45pm (no earlier please). They will walk up to the church, and back to school after the service, with staff.

<u>Friday 16 December: Christmas parties in school:</u> Christmas parties take place on Friday 16 December. In a change to previous years, <u>all classes</u> will be partying during the school day and should be collected at 3.30pm as usual. The children may bring with them party clothes to change into. Each class teacher will be sending out requests for party food contributions nearer the time. Thank you, in advance, for your donations.

<u>Monday 19 December: Pantomime :</u> We are off to see "Peter Pan" at the Embassy Theatre in Skegness on Monday 19 December. The coaches will leave school just after 9.00am. We will have lunch before we return to school so all children will need a packed lunch (either from home or ordered from the Farm Kitchen by midnight on Tuesday 13 December). The theatre has a lower foyer which we can use to picnic in if the weather is awful but the children will need warm clothes including hats, scarves, gloves and a warm coat in case we decide to picnic outside on the beach!
