## We need your help!

Our local Parish Council have asked us to forward a letter regarding traffic safety around Kirkby on Bain and our school site to you all. Please see separate letter. It has been written in response to the results received from a reactive speed sign placed within the village earlier this year and feedback from local residents. I am quite sure you will be as shocked as I was to read of the incredibly high speeds recorded during the time the sign was in place and whilst I sincerely hope that these speeds were rare, I am sure you will agree with me that even one occasion is too many. We have also received reports from some of you directly this term.

Our main goal when considering parking or travel near our school is to protect the safety of our pupils, their families and our local community. I am quite sure that you would welcome any efforts to help keep your children safe.

If you do need to park near school at any point, please park in accordance with the Highway Code, making sure that all driveways to the houses and the Church remain free and that the roads remain easily passable for all vehicles. Please avoid parking in our staff parking area as we have members of staff who arrive at the end of the day to run after school clubs. We need these staff to be able to park and be in school to supervise those children who are remaining on site beyond the end of the school day.

We would also appreciate your support in encouraging other road users to adhere to the speed limit. We are aware that other drivers, who are not parents of our pupils, use the route through Kirkby on Bain and they may not be as aware of the school and the high numbers of children who walk this route. Ensuring that our parents and staff are driving with due care will hopefully impact positively on their driving too. We would like to do what we can to help make and keep the roads safe for all of our community. In order to make school more obvious to those drivers who are not parents at our school but are choosing to use the road through Kirkby on Bain as a route to somewhere else, we are going to have some banners printed for display along the main road.



Can you design a banner that will help keep our local community safe? How can you make it attractive so that people look at it and read it? What messages do you need to communicate to the reader?

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How can you persuade people to take notice and act? How can you help the message stick in their mind? If you think you are the designer we are looking for, get your art materials out and start creating! Please use half an A4 or A3 sheet (folded in half with long edge to long edge to create a long, thin strip) to create your design. If you need some paper to use, please ask me and I will give you some. All designs will need to be handed in at the school office by Friday 1st November with your name marked clearly on the back. The final design(s) for printing will be voted for by representatives from our road safety pupil group, our local community, parents, staff and our parish council. Look out for the designs and voting slips. We will do our best to get the banner printed and in place straight away. I look forward to seeing your designs! Thank you in advance for your support with this. We do appreciate that finding somewhere to park safely can be difficult but our children's safety must remain the absolute priority. We would rather you park safely and be a few minutes late than create a safety risk for others.



What a privilege it was to find out about another part of the world from people who actually live there. Our children were so excited to share the life our school with our visitors from Lebanon and had a wealth of questions to ask them too. I hope they told you all about it. We will be taking part in some collaborative projects during this academic year.
